We are delighted with how well this new award has been received and would like to thank all who submitted nominations. Runners up awards were presented to: Joseph Dredge, 19, in recognition for his outstanding achievements as an enthusiastic member of Sedgefield Referees Association who now mentors young, newly qualified referees and has recently been selected to be part of the team representing County FA at the prestigious IberCup in Portugal; and to Adam White, who at only 17, provides sound and lighting services for drama performances and gigs in venues around the town, as well as being a stalwart member of 1st Sedgefield Scout Group which has given him the opportunity to be an ambassador at the World Scouting .lamboree in the summer

The Young Citizen of the Year Award was presented to Victoria Sirrell, aged 20. Victoria has been a member of girl quiding since the age of five, progressing from Rainbows right through to Young Leader, even representing the Guides on international visits. Last year, Victoria took on the role of leader for the newly formed Sedgefield Rangers, enabling 14 Guides who were approaching the upper age limit to continue in the movement. Victoria's peers and Guide Leaders have accredited her dedication to girl guiding as being fundamental in keeping the Brownies going, as she did not hesitate to step in when the unit was at risk of closure. Victoria continues to dedicate every Tuesday evening to girl guiding alongside full time work and is an inspiration to the young girls she welcomes and supports every week.
