During 2016/17 Sedgefield Town Council will be operating the following working groups:

The Estates Working Group reports to the council's Policy & Resources Committee. For 2016/17 the Estates Working Group priority activities will be the refurbishment of the Parish Hall and the development of the new area of Butterwick Road Cemetery.

The Finance Working Group reports to the council's Policy & Resources Committee. For 2016/17 the Finance Working Group's priority will be the development of a Medium Term Financial Plan and an Asset Management Plan.

The Policy & Records Working Group also reports to the council's Policy & Resources Committee. For 2016/17 this group will be reviewing a number of the council's existing policies and also developing a number of other policies on the advice of our Internal

The Fireworks Working Group reports to the council's Community Development & Engagement Committee and is responsible for organising our annual fireworks event on 4th November 2016.

The Youth Working Group also reports to the council's Community Development & Engagement Committee and is currently working with Investing In Children and the Area Action Partnership to analyse the findings of a Youth Event held on 30th April 2016 in the Parish Hall.
