Tree Works On Town Council Owned Land

In the summer of 2021 the Town Council commissioned an independent Tree Officer to undertake a review of the condition of all trees on Town Council-owned land. This review has now taken place and whilst the majority of the tree stocks are in very good condition, some works have been identified in a prioritised order for addressing over the coming 12 months. Some initial work has already been undertaken around the central village green areas and Beacon Lane Cemetery which has included the felling of several trees in a decayed state or which were unsuitable for the location in which they had grown, meaning they would soon start to decline. Trees which have been felled will be replaced with tree species which are appropriate for each location. Necessary permissions for all tree works within the Conservation Area are sought before any such work is undertaken. The purpose of this work is to ensure that we look after our tree stocks to ensure they are safe and thrive.

Council Tax Precept 2022/23

Over recent years there have been significant changes in local government funding which has culminated in the removal of grant funding for this Council, however this is offset to some extent by new housing. It is anticipated that further change will also be seen in the coming years. Every year, each Town and Parish Council sets a precept which is a charge that is determined locally and is added to, and collected along with, Council Tax. This precept money is then used to provide services and amenities within the Parish. For Sedgefield Town Council to continue to deliver its current services as well as extend Butterwick Road Cemetery, undertake significant tree works, protect areas of village green and deal with increasing energy prices relating to Sedgefield Parish Hall it has been necessary to increase the precept for 2022/23. This equates to an increase of 7.4% or £13.13 per Band D household per annum.

MAYOR'S UPDATE

This was a great event attended by approximately 1000 runners during the course of the day. It was inspiring to see so much enthusiasm and talent on show.

I have represented Sedgefield at an array of events to support other Mayors in our region and their chosen charities. I have attended civic dinners and carol services at Hartlepool, Seaham, Spennymoor, Shildon and Great Aycliffe; all very different and enjoyable.

Due to illness my consort attended in my place a presentation to Howard and Barbara Smith who have retired from the Sedgefield In Bloom Group due to relocating outside the area. This presentation was an appreciation of their continued work helping to make our town such a pleasure to look at and live in. Norma Neal also received recognition for her sterling work as Secretary of the Bloom Group, a role which she has now retired from.

Finally, I want to thank everyone in Sedgefield who supported my recent festive appeals. My first appeal was for a gift for a child of a family in need. This was a huge success and many beautiful presents wrapped with love and thought were donated. These were all given to the Visitor Centre at a prison and when the Christmas family days were to be held, all the children would receive a gift appropriate for their age and gender. The second appeal was for something for a homeless person or person in sheltered accommodation but outside during the day. The variety of gifts was fantastic including hats, scarves, jumpers, sweets and toiletries. Food was also given to help the centres with meal preparations. Hundreds of gifts were given with such amazing thought. All gifts were delivered prior to Christmas.

- Notice is hereby given that by reason of Councillor resignation one vacancy has occurred among the members of the Town Council. Any persons willing to fill this vacancy should request from the Clerk an application form and return this on or before Friday 25th February 2022. The applicant's name must appear on the current register of the Voters List or the applicant should during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date resided in or within three miles of the parish or the applicant's only place of work during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date is in the parish. The applicant must not be debarred from standing as a Councillor.
- PUBLIC elections cannot be held until the year 2025 but for the interim period election to the aforesaid Council will be voted for by the present sitting number of Councillors.
