Traditionally, at the close of the Annual Town Meeting in May, the town council, in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Sedgefield and Sedgefield Development Trust, announces the winners of the Citizen of the Year and Young Citizen of the Year awards. Unfortunately, due to the national lockdown, this event did not take place. We are now re-opening nominations for a combined 2019 & 2020 award for both categories. Nomination forms will be included in this month's Sedgefield News or can be found and printed from our website. The deadline for nominations is Monday 16th November 2020. Any nominations made earlier in the year are still valid and will be considered alongside any others that are received. The winners will be announced virtually at the end of our 2020 festive event programme on Wednesday 16th December 2020.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Sedgefield's Remembrance Sunday commemorations will need to be different this year. The difficult decision has been made not to hold a church service in St Edmund's Church on the morning of Sunday 8th November 2020. Instead, a series of recordings will be shown on the town council's website at www.sedgefieldtowncouncil.gov.uk/category/council-news and Twitter account @SedgefieldTC leading up to 11am.

There will be **no public event around the War Memorial** on the village green at 11am. Following the two-minute silence, wreaths will be laid by the Lord Lieutenant's representative, Chairman of Sedgefield Town Council and a Durham County Council representative. This small, very carefully managed commemoration will be broadcast live on Facebook (details will be shared on Twitter and through the residents' database once finalised). Other organisations wishing to lay a wreath have been requested by the town council to do so at their own convenience after 1pm.

displaying a poppy or poppy imagery in your front window.



standing at your doorstep at 11am on Sunday 8th November 2020 to observe the national two-minute silence. The church bells of St Edmund's Church will ring at 11am to signal the start of the silence.
