ACTIVE TRAVEL PROJECT: GETTING AROUND SEDGEFIELD AND FISHBURN

Over recent months, the Town Council has been working with partners in Durham County Council and Sedgefield Development Trust's BAT (Bicycle Active Travel) Group on a programme of 'active travel' initiatives to make improvements to how residents and visitors can get around our towns and villages, on foot (with or without a buggy), on bicycle, or when using mobility aids. This project is also looking at highway safety and wider traffic management issues. To help inform our own direction of travel with this, we want to hear your views on what you want to see happen here and are launching a public consultation exercise for that reason.

Our partnership has already identified the need for more bike stands located at the central village green area in Sedgefield. Work is underway to progress this and secure funding for installation. We have also identified that there is poor path linkage between Sedgefield and Hardwick Park and are pleased to report that funding to improve that has recently been secured, through contributions from the Area Action Partnership's Area Budget, County Councillors' Neighbourhood Budgets (their Towns and Villages allocations) and from the park.

Looking ahead, we may not be able to achieve everything that you want but your views will certainly steer us as we seek to develop more schemes through the relevant departments, agencies and partners and secure funding to deliver them. POSITION VACANT: PARISH HALL WEEKEND RELIEF OFFICER

Sedgefield Town Council are seeking to appoint a Parish Hall Weekend Relief Officer. The purpose of this role is:

- To ensure the opening and closing of the Parish Hall around bookings

NOTICE OF CASUAL VACANCY: COUNCILLOR CO-OPTION

Notice is hereby given that by reason of Councillor resignation, one vacancy has occurred among the members of the Town Council. Any persons willing to fill this vacancy should request from the Clerk an application form and return this on or before Friday 31st January 2023. The applicant's name must appear on the current register of the Voters List or the applicant should, during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date, have resided in or within three miles of the parish or the applicant's only place of work during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date is in the parish. The applicant must not be debarred from standing as a Councillor.

PUBLIC elections cannot be held until the year 2025 but for the interim period election to the aforesaid Council will be voted for by the present sitting number of Councillors.

Sedgefield Town Council is legally required to undertake headstone safety testing annually to ensure that headstones are stable and safe. Testing in Butterwick Rd Cemetery, Beacon Lane Cemetery and Winterton Cemetery will take place soon. Any headstones found to be unstable will be marked with warning tape and we will, where such details are known, contact the next of kin as well as place advisory notices on the cemetery noticeboard.
