TREE WORKS IN SEDGEFIELD

2021, the Town Council In commissioned an independent tree officer to assess the status of all trees on Town Council-owned land and as a result, a programme of tree work for 2022/23 has now been agreed. The Town Council has sought all necessary permissions from Durham County Council and appointed a contractor to carry out the work, which is due to commence over the coming months. The intention of this work is to ensure our tree stocks are healthy, protected and safe. nurtured but in some instances trees will have to be removed based upon the arboricultural advice we have received.
