DCC Dog Orders

On 1st June 2017, Durham County Council introduced a new Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) to encourage responsible dog ownership and tackle issues such as dog fouling and strays.

This means it will be an offence to fail to pick up dog mess, allow a dog to stray, fail to put a dog on a lead when directed to do so by an authorised officer, and allow a dog into a fenced off play area. Anyone seen flouting the new rules will be issued with a fixed penalty notice.

A Message from the Mayor

Elizabeth and I have already attended a wide variety of events in Sedgefield and it has been great to meet many people and organisations who do so much for our community. It was a particular pleasure to welcome my counterpart from our German twin town of Hamminkeln, Burgermeister Bernd Romanski, and his wife Heike, when they joined a visit organised by Sedgefield Twinning Association.



Recently, I announced details of the charities that I will be supporting during my term as mayor. I will be raising funds for the Great North Air Ambulance Service (GNAAS), the Macular Society and other local good causes. Youth Club UPDATE

We are pleased to report that the Sedgefield Youth Club was launched on Monday 3rd July 2017, with dedicated sessions for children in school years 3-6 running from 6pm-7pm and a later session for young people in school years 7-11, from 7pm-8:30pm.

These sessions are being funded by the town council and run on our behalf by professional youth workers. The youth club has had a break over the summer holidays and will restart on Monday 4th September 2017. Young people will be working with us to try to secure grant funding to purchase items of equipment they would like to use in future sessions, and to explore the potential for developing additional youth provision initiatives in Sedgefield. The Sedgefield Plan UPDATE

Following receipt of the independent examiner's report, Sedgefield Town Council, in conjunction with members of the plan's steering group and officers from Durham County Council, have modified The Sedgefield Plan to meet the needs of the examiner, but still reflect the views of the community gathered during the numerous consultation exercises conducted during its development.

This modified plan was formally resubmitted to Durham County Council on 13th March 2017, with the request that it then be resubmitted to the independent examiner.

Since this time, there has been active dialogue between the town council and Durham County Council as there is a significant difference of opinion between both as to the correct procedure for this plan moving towards its ultimate goal of a community referendum.

A meeting was held on 21st July 2017 between Sedgefield Town Council and Durham County Council at which the county council agreed to seek independent counsel advice in order to get a definitive answer on the procedural issues now holding up The Sedgefield Plan. Butterwick Road Cemetery UPDATE

Work is now actively underway to confirm that expansion of Butterwick Road Cemetery into the area behind the existing shelter and ashes garden can take place.

We are confident that such expansion will be allowed, but this will be a significant project for Sedgefield Town Council and will involve many external organisations. It will be some time before this expansion is completed and it is important that we conserve as much space as possible in the existing cemetery to ensure that interments can take place. For this reason, with immediate effect and for the foreseeable future, the practice of pre-purchasing grave plots has been suspended, with the only exception being that a spouse can pre-purchase a grave plot to be next to their already interred partner.

New Way To Report To Durham County Council

Durham County Council has been rolling out its new online complaints service over recent months.

Due to this new process, the town council is no longer able to facilitate complaints relating to the following Durham County Council areas: roads, footpaths, streetlights, rubbish and recycling, commercial waste, neighbourhood wardens, stray dogs, abandoned vehicles, pest control, street cleaning, litter and dog fouling, graffiti, fly tipping and fly posting.
