

Mayor 2016/17 - Cllr Chris Lines



Councillor Chris Lines was appointed the Mayor of Sedgefield in May 2016.

“I’m hugely honoured to have been appointed to this role. I have lived in Sedgefield for most of my life, as have many of my family. I loved growing up here, was later married here and now I run a business in the Manor House in the centre of the town, and my wife and I are bringing up our own children here too. There have been changes in Sedgefield over the years and, inevitably, more are on the horizon. However, there has always been a really strong community spirit here and it’s really important that we sustain that for this and future generations. As Mayor of Sedgefield, I aim to play my role in doing so over the next 12 months. I hope that residents and businesses will be keen to work with me on events and initiatives that will benefit some very deserving charities and I will welcome any offers of support.”

Chris Lines raised money during the year for three specific charities:

- The Lullaby Trust, which provides specialist support for bereaved families and anyone affected by a sudden infant death. The trust has been chosen in memory of local girl Alice Robinson, who passed away in November 2015 aged just 11 months. Alice was the daughter of Sedgefield residents William and Katy Robinson, good friends of the mayor and his family.
- The Sir Bobby Robson Foundation, in memory of his mother Margaret Lines, who died in 2009 after a brave battle with cancer. Lines received care at the Freeman Hospital in Newcastle, where much of the foundation’s work is focused.
- Friends of Sedgefield Harriers (FoSH), a charity that was founded to support amateur sport and improve sports provision in Sedgefield. FoSH is leading the campaign to build training facilities in Sedgefield that will benefit the hundreds of young people in Sedgefield who participate in sport.

During his year as mayor, Chris Lines raised an incredible £7,200 towards his three chosen charities – The Lullaby Trust, Sir Bobby Robson Foundation, Friends of Sedgefield Harriers – and other local organisations. At the Annual Town Meeting on Tuesday 9th May 2017, Chris Lines presented cheques to the following location organisations:

Taste & See, Pop-In, DIDO, Sedgfield Squash Club, Sedgfield Players, SPYS, Sedgfield Village Veterans, Sedgfield Development Trust, Sedgfield Lyrics Youth Choir, Lirica, One Step Forward, Sedgfield Youth FC, Sedgfield In Bloom, Sowers & Growers, Sedgfield Primary School PTA, Sedgfield Hardwick Primary School PTA, 1st Sedgfield Scout Group, Sedgfield Guides/Brownies.

I managed to raise over £7,200, which has been shared among the three charities and numerous community groups.

I have had some fun, and I hope that some of the people around me have been able to share that enjoyment!

All of the above was only possible due to the numerous people who supported my events (in many different ways) and I am extremely grateful to everyone who contributed. Thank you all.

I owe the team at Sedgfield Town Council a huge debt of thanks, along with fellow town councillors, county councillors and civic dignitaries from around the region, and of course a large number of Sedgfield residents.

Numerous businesses have provided prizes for events or helped publicise my initiatives, and that has been very helpful, while venues such as St. Edmund's Church, the Parish Hall, Ceddesfeld Hall and the Manor House have been invaluable. Sedgfield's schools have also helped to spread the word about mayoral events, and provided performers who have been the highlight of civic events.

Finally, I would like to pay tribute to my friends and family, who have played a huge role in my year as Mayor of Sedgfield. Whether volunteering at or attending events, or contributing in other ways, they have provided more assistance than I can adequately acknowledge. In particular, I am enormously grateful to my sons Ciaran, Charlie and Samuel, and to my amazing wife and (reluctant but dedicated!) Mayoress of Sedgfield, Catherine. Whether they want me or not, they can have me back now!
