CEMETERIES: HEADSTONE SAFETY TESTING 2023

Sedgefield Town Council is legally required to undertake headstone safety testing annually to ensure that headstones are stable and safe. Testing in Butterwick Road Cemetery, Beacon Lane Cemetery and Winterton Cemetery will take place over the coming months. Any headstones found to be unstable will be marked with warning tape and we will, where such details are known, contact the next of kin as well as place advisory notices on the cemetery noticeboard.
